It's hard to believe, but Fall is almost upon us. Public schools will be starting in just over a week. College campuses have already begun welcoming students into the dorms. And despite the unabated summer heat, the autumnal equinox is less than a month away, promising shorter days, cooler evenings, and crisp mornings. If you can't tell, Fall is my favorite season. And I'm more than ready for it. I'm also ready and excited for us as a church community to gear back up after the Sabbath of Summer. In addition to worship, there will be quite a few ways for us to gather in smaller groups to deepen our fellowship and our faith this Fall.

For the Youth, there's the **Youth Group**. The Youth Group will meet two Sunday evenings a month from 5 to 7pm, starting on Sunday, Sept 11. One of those meetings each month will be held together with the Youth Group of Church of Our Savior, Montpelier. For those Youth who are preparing to be Confirmed when the Bishop visits in December, there will be a **Confirmation Class** held over 12 Sunday evenings this Fall, from 7 to 8pm. This class will also begin on Sunday, Sept 11.

For the adults, there are several possible groups to get involved in. The Men's Book Group continues meeting at 7:30am, every other Thursday morning at Ashland Coffee & Tea. On Sept 8, we'll begin our Fall book, *Mere Christianity* by C.S. Lewis. The Women's Book Group will also meet on Thursday, Sept 8 (at 10am), reconvening after summer break, to discuss *All the Light We Cannot See*. And, of course, the Adult Sunday School will begin meeting again on Sunday, Sept 11 at 9am. Our topic for the Fall will be Aledieval Christianity.

Finally, in addition to these groups and classes, I'll be offering a new opportunity for exploring our faith with meetings every other Thursday evening beginning on Sept 15. These meetings will begin at 6:30pm with snacks or a small something to eat. At 7pm, we'll transition to instruction and discussion, and be done by 8pm. We'll be covering the basic foundation of our faith, but taking our time to go deep. Each "term" will cover one of the following topics: Covenant & the Ten Commandments, The Lord's Prayer & Common Prayer, Creed & Sacraments, Anglican Tradition & the Episcopal Church. Tentatively, I'm calling this **The Way of Discipleship**.




