#### From Father Nik

In Christ, God has fulfilled His promise to establish a new covenant. This is the covenant He promised through the prophet Jeremiah (31:31-34), the law of which would be written on the heart. This new commandment of the new covenant in Christ is written on the heart because the new commandment is for us to love one another as He has loved us (Jn 13:34). And God chose to show His love by not clinging to the status of His deity but emptying Himself to live among us, as one of us—limited by space and time and the needs of a body, dependent on others as we all are, and living in the shadow of death (Phil 2:5-8). In other words, to save us from sin and death and to write the law of love on our hearts, God took on a human heart, fleshy and pumping blood through a body like yours and mine. But in this world dominated by death, beating hearts eventually stop—even when it is the heart of the Lord of Life.

In this fallen world, twisted by violence and distorted by sin, death has become the great enemy of love, undermining the law of love with each heart it stops. Death separates us from those we love. Death brings to ruin the great projects of our love and passion. Death dashes hope and drives away faith. Death tempts us to turn our love inwards, transgressing the commandment that we love one another—which Death makes too painful—and seducing us to love ourselves only. We know deep down that Death will get the final word, so we assume that there aren't enough beats left in our hearts to waste our love on others. And secretly we hope that by insulating ourselves in a cocoon of self-love, shutting out others on whose lives we see the signs of Death's shadow, we might just get out of life alive.

After the Flood, God acknowledged that sin and Death had distorted the desires of our hearts so that "the inclination of the human heart is evil from youth" (Gen 8:21). With each covenant, He bestowed His love to redirect our hearts to Him, and through Him, to others. At Sinai, he established the rituals of sacrifice to teach us that His *love is strong as death* (Song of Songs 8:6). But we would not know the depths of His love until He had a heart that beat in rhythm with ours, a heart that could and would also be stopped by death. We would not know the depths of his love until his love for us led him, while still a young man, to face death head on. We would not know the depths of His love for us until he loved us to the end (Jn 13:1), establishing a new covenant with us in His blood, forgetting our sin forever (Jer 31:34), and writing the law of love upon our hearts.


