

From Father Nik

What it means for the Church to be a community of witness is that we're a people drawn together by the incredible love God has shown us—continues to show us—in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It means that we have encountered God making all things new in the resurrection of his Son, & we've been given the gift of participation in this sanctification of all creation. Therefore, we gather in worship, proclamation, & service to live this Good News in word & deed. We gather together because in each other, in our life together as a parish community, we see God's new creation, His great revolution, His peaceable kingdom breaking into this world. In each other, and in the community we have around the Eucharistic table, we catch glimpses of the grace of God, won for us by Christ, raising the dead to life.

We need only listen to our lessons from the Book of Acts during this Eastertide to hear how God's grace transformed the lives of the disciples. Even when Jesus was among them as one still walking toward death, they failed to see how God was uniquely in their midst, calling them into new life. But after his death & resurrection, the disciples became a community of witness. It is our inclination to focus on individual saints, like Peter, the hot-tempered, peasant fisherman who became one of the pillars of the early Church until he was crucified like his Lord; James the Just, Jesus' own brother who doubted Christ during his life but then became the Bishop of the Church in Jerusalem until he suffered a martyr's death; & Paul, the brilliant Pharisee who persecuted the Church until the Risen Christ revealed to him the Gospel and appointed him as the Apostle to the Gentiles. But they were not lone heroes; they were members of a greater cloud of witnesses.

Peter, James, & Paul couldn't have done what they did, lived the lives that they lived, and died the deaths that they died, had they not been supported & surrounded by that community of witness of which they were but members. Their witness was no more meaningful or esteemed by God than the witness of those about whom we know very little, like Mary Magdalene, Thecla, & Priscilla. And the witness of these saints we've named was only a part of and made possible by that whole community of witness whose names have long ago been forgotten. They haven't been forgotten by God. Christ promised that in bearing witness to him, he also bears witness to us (Lk 12:8/Matt 10:32). When his kingdom comes in its fullness, he will call each and every one of us by name, out of death & into everlasting life. So, *if you cannot preach like Peter, if you cannot pray like Paul*, you're still a part of this community of witness that *tells the love of Jesus who died and rose for all.*

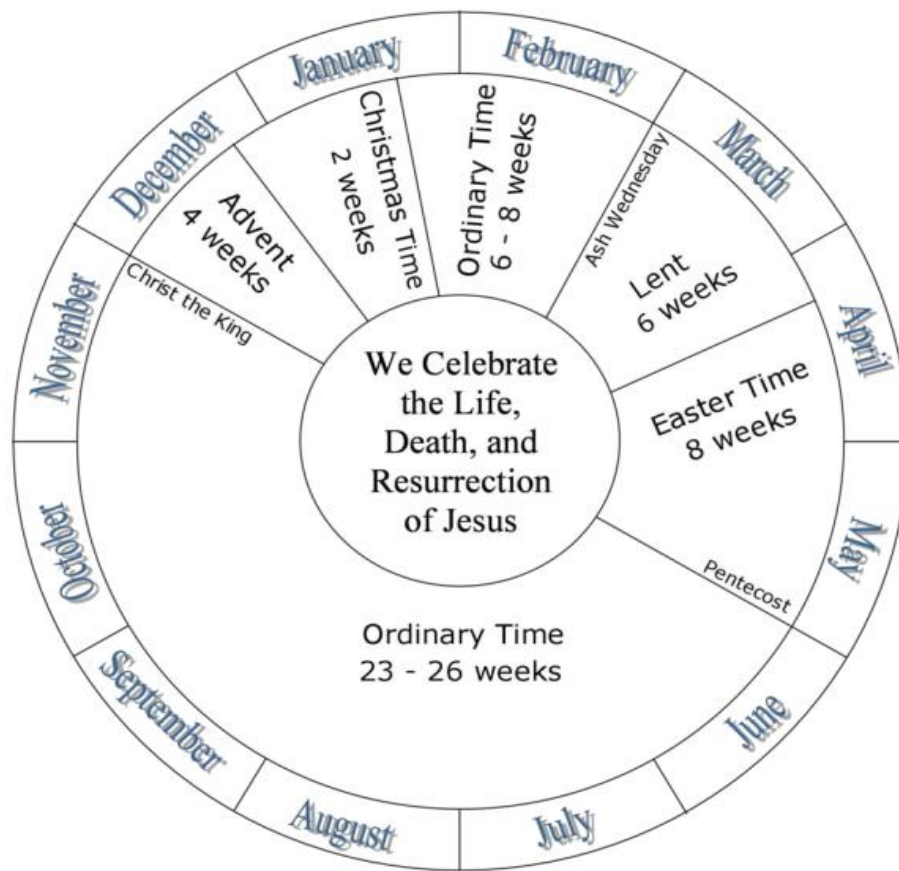
Small Groups
